Reece, a young person supported by GISDA, has been awarded as runner up in the Young Volunteer of the Year award at the Welsh Charities Awards 2024.

Reece helps frequently at our LGBTQ+ Club in Caernarfon, volunteers weekly at Ysbyty Gwynedd and leads craft sessions for our young people. We are so proud of you Reece.



# MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING AWARDS 2024

We are so pleased that we reached the Inspirational Charitable Organisation award finalists alongside candidates dedicated to prioritising the wellbeing of others.



We are proud to announce that Anya, an 18-year-old supported by GISDA, has won the 2024 Centrepoint UK Partner Award.

This award recognises her remarkable journey and resilience in overcoming significant challenges throughout her life. She was rewarded by Prince William at the Centerpoint Awards at the British Museum - London.

The Centrepoint Awards celebrate the achievements of young people who have demonstrated exceptional courage and commitment. As the UK's leading youth homelessness charity, Centrepoint supports almost 14,000 young individuals each year, highlighting the diverse talents and achievements of those who have faced adversity.

Anya has shown strength to move on from the darkness of her childhood and has created a bright future, not only for herself, but also to support other young people experiencing homelessness.

Moreover, she has managed to excel in her exams. She has used her lived experiences to influence politicians to support LGBTQ+ people in Gwynedd.

#### **GWYNEDD SPORTS AWARDS 2024**



We are delighted that GISDA has won the Active Employer of the Year 2024 award at the Gwynedd Sports Awards.

Reece, a young leader from GISDA joined the 2024 EU-UK Youth Dialogue in London, where 150 youth voices came together to discuss important issues such as youth mobility, inclusion, and the relationship between the United Kingdom and Europe. This inspiring event connected young people with policy makers to promote opportunities across Europe.

They highlighted the impact of exchange programmes such as Erasmus+ and our Welsh exchange programme, JOURNEY! We are extremely proud of Reece for representing the youth of Gwynedd and Wales in this influential session!

# EU-UK YOUTH DIALOGUE 2024



Kaya, our TAPI Project Manager, traveled to Parma with Project TRIP to attend an LGBTQ+ forum organized by the Ali Forney Center, a New York-based agency that supports LGBTQ+ youth. The event brought together 25 different agencies from 16 countries around the world.

The forum was an invaluable opportunity to network with other organisations that support LGBTQ+ individuals globally. It was a platform to share best practices, learn about the challenges they face, and explore how they address these issues.

# HOUSING SUPPORT: SUPPORTING HOMELESS YOUNG PEOPLE IN GWYNEDD

GISDA's Housing Support project helps young people who are homeless or at risk of losing their homes, giving them the stability and support they need to build a brighter future. As our largest project, it provides an important service to the vulnerable young people of Gwynedd, 62 individuals can receive support from us at any one time.

As part of the project, young people receive comprehensive support tailored to their needs through our therapeutic support model, "Model FI." This support enables them to understand their rights and develop the skills and responsibility they need to progress to independent living.

#### **NEW HOUSE IN CAERNARFON**

We bought this house in April this year and it is now ready for a young person to move in.

This is the first house GISDA has bought and renovated without public money at all.

Academi Adra offers courses that give a week of training then a week of Work experience, either with a team at Adra or with one of their Partners. After two weeks there is an offer for everyone to apply for a paid work placement.




#### PROSIECT 'FEL MERCH' YR URDD



#### **COMMISIONER FOR WALES**





## PARTNERIAETH FRAN WEN




Our partnership with Fran Wen, a Welsh theatre company, began in 2022.

The Nabod group, funded by Children in Need, was set up by bringing together members of GISDA's LGBTQ+ clubs from Blaenau Ffestiniog, Caernarfon and Pwllheli to work with Frân Wen.

The project provides an inclusive and safe space for young creatives to work alongside multidisciplinary artists – and it's one that has grown into something much bigger than expected.

Inspirational ideas emerged from the early sessions and over time the group came together to refine these, developing themes and characters they wanted to focus on.

At the same time, they were having conversations with various artists about things they aspired to in terms of creative processes – scale, ambition, co-creation, and opportunities to work in new ways. And so that was the beginning of OLION, with the vision of offering artists and audiences something different.



## **OLION**

Throughout OLION rehearsals, members of the NABOD group shadowed different artists based on their interests. Anya, a young person supported by GISDA, had been given the opportunity to shadow Creative Director Gethin in the rehearsal room, and Reece had been working with costume and set designer Elin Steele.

It has been a privilege to work with Fran Wen, this is a group of young people who have dabbled in skills and gained wide experiences as part of this project.
